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Activities and Events

EYFS – Mrs H. Robbins: Head of EYFS

We have been very busy in Reception! All of the children have loved sharing 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchins. This story tells the tale of Rosie the hen on her adventure across the farmyard avoiding the sly fox. We have been creating our own story maps, retelling Rosie's Walk through actions and writing our favourite part of the story. In our maths lessons, Farmer Pete and his ten sheep have been helping us to learn our number bonds to ten.

At the end of March, we were delighted to welcome Miller's Ark Farm to our school field. Farmer Helen taught us lots of interesting information about the animals including what kind of feet the animals have, why they need ear tags and what their hooves tell us. We were able to touch donkeys, sheep, goats and Kunekune piglets. "The donkey made a loud noise!" "The piglets fell asleep inside their bucket".



Year 1 – Miss G. Hearn: Head of Year 1

Our topic in the spring term was 'God's and My Wonderful World'. As part of this topic, the children have been learning all about animals and the different groups to which they belong. As a hook for this topic, we had an Animal Workshop at school. The children were able to hold a selection of animals such as an African land snail, a giant millipede and even a snake! They also saw a tarantula and watched it move across the studio floor.



We felt incredibly lucky to have this opportunity in school; many of the children described it as "the best day ever". It has been lovely to hear Year 1 use some of the facts and vocabulary they learnt that morning to deepen their understanding of animals.

Year 2 – Miss N. Maloney: Head of Year 2 & Senior Teacher

As part of our geography topic this half term, the whole of Year 2 had the chance to undertake some field work in their local area. As the three classes went on separate days, it gave us the chance to compare the results of our findings.

The purpose of our trip was to undertake a traffic survey on the grassed area outside the Lion Retail Park. They had to count all the vehicles that passed in a ten-minute period. The children learned about tally charts and pictograms and had the chance to predict what would be the most popular form of transport before the field trip.

On return to school, the children totalled up their tally marks and compared results with their predictions. We created a simple map of their journey and included a key to ensure a variety of different cross-curricular skills were involved.

The children were so enthusiastic and well behaved. They were super ambassadors for our school.



Year 3 – Miss H. Fail: Head of Year 3 & Senior Teacher

In science last term, Year 3 enjoyed learning about 'Light.' They used torches to investigate which materials block light. The children showed excellent understanding of key terminology including translucent, opaque and transparent. Demonstrating their artistic talents when learning about Pablo Picasso, they sketched their own portrait in his abstract style.



As part of our Lenten preparations, Mrs M. Smith came in to lead a reflective liturgy on the Stations of the Cross. The children conducted themselves in a reverent and reflective manner, taking part in prayers and songs. Additionally, Year 3 were delighted to lead the final Mass of the spring term. All children took part in the Lenten Song and they sang confidently and beautifully. This made for a memorable start to the Mass. We were very proud of the children's exemplary behaviour and maturity towards leading this Mass.



Year 4 – Mrs M. Cannon: Head of Year 4


In Year 4, the children really enjoyed learning about South Africa through the text 'Journey to Jo'Burg' by Beverley Naidoo. Once they had explored the characters and the storyline, the children went on to study Nelson Mandela. They worked so hard on this and presented their learning as a beautiful double page non-chronological report.

In geography, we have been developing our understanding of rivers and the features of rivers at different points. The children will go on to extend this learning to looking at rivers around the world with an in-depth case study on the Amazon River. They are excited to get started on this learning!



Year 5 – Miss E. Roe: Head of Year 5

At the end of last half term, 5M and 5P lead Key Stage 2 beautifully through a reflective Stations of The Cross Liturgy. Everyone made an excellent contribution, whether it was acting, dancing, singing or reading. We will continue to reflect on these events during our next RE topic.



Year 5 have enjoyed building on our science learning in Design and Technology by designing and making balloon buggies. We were able to use our knowledge of forces to help us with the design and make improvements once we had tested them. This half term we are looking forward to continuing our geography learning, thinking about what India is doing to save the tigers.

Year 6 – Mrs T. Steer: Head of Year 6 & Assistant Headteacher

It has been lovely to greet Year 6 returning after the Easter holidays for the final term of Primary school.

March was a fantastic month filled with some sensational work. On the final day of term, Mrs Birch joined us to celebrate our RE writing – a beautiful piece about the Stations of the Cross.




Library - Mr R. Wise

Marian Liturgy

Reconciliation Service – Year 6

On Wednesday 1st March, children from Year 6 led us through a liturgy of Reconciliation. Through song, prayer, reflection and drama, the children led us to consider what it means to forgive and how the example of Jesus inspires us to love our neighbour in all circumstances. Beginning with a dramatisation of the Gospel reading about Zacchaeus, this was followed by a reflection about how we can all make mistakes and get things wrong, but God loves us as we are, and his mercy is endless.

Thank you Year 6, for leading us through this liturgy; they spoke with confidence and with reverence, and had clearly worked hard to make this a beautifully spiritual experience for everyone.

Sacrament of Reconciliation – Pastoral Team

On Friday 3rd March, there was the opportunity for children from Years 4, 5 and 6 to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation with Canon Rob, Father Peter and Father Nick. Lots of children volunteered to attend and having already attended the liturgy, the children were well prepared and ready to share this important sacrament.

Lower School Holy Week Liturgy



All of the children in Lower School celebrated a Holy Week Liturgy together. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 led the Liturgy with prayers, reading the stories of Holy Week and acting them out so that we could really think about what happened for Jesus during that week. We reflected upon how we could welcome Jesus just like the crowds in Jerusalem did; how we can serve others – just like Jesus served his disciples by washing their feet; how we can forgive others – just like Jesus forgave those who crucified him and how we can share the good news of Jesus rising to new life on Easter Sunday.

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Parking and being considerate to our neighbours

Onslow Crescent gets very busy at peak times. Not everyone can park here!

Can we suggest please that parents endeavour to park one minute further away and walk if they are able. This is also healthier for your children too to get this daily exercise.

Please always park considerately so that we keep disruption for our neighbours to a minimum. It is obviously never acceptable to park across a neighbour's drive or to park so close to it that residents can't see clearly to pull out onto the road to leave their house.

Please note **it is always illegal to park on yellow zig-zag lines anywhere at certain times.**

Rule 243 of the Highway Code indicates a range of places where motorists must not park, including on a bend, a dropped kerb or the brow of a hill. It also states that drivers must not park near a school entrance or anywhere that would prevent access for emergency.

Surrey County Council and Surrey Police are working in partnership to crack down on people who drive and park in a selfish manner. It is our children who are most at risk if people stop, drop or park selfishly.

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School Office

Lunch money for summer term 2023 – Mrs M. O’Riordan, school office

School dinner costs for summer term are as follows: 1st half term £72.90, 2nd Half Term, £94.50, full term £167.40. Please remember that should you wish to change your child’s meal choice from hot to cold or vice versa, one week’s notice is required in writing.

We have had a number of occasions when parents have changed without notification to the school office. Not only does this cause an administrative difficulty when numbers do not tally but also means that the school is liable for the cost of the food order.

Therefore, if you change your child from school dinners to packed lunches without notification you will be liable for outstanding monies due to Surrey County Council.

Free School Meal Eligibility & Pupil Premium- Mrs C Turner- Bursar

We are aware, in the current climate, that some families are struggling financially. If your circumstances have changed or if you earn less than £16,190 your child/children may be entitled to free school meals. By completing a form we can check this for you and usually we receive a response within 48 hours. Once eligibility is confirmed your child /children are the entitled to free schools meals for the duration of their education at primary school. Currently Surrey County Council are also funding food vouchers for the holiday periods. Competition Update

Spring Festival

On 28th February, some of our Year 5 children travelled to the Royal Holloway University for a spring festival. Learning new skills in five different sports, they received expert tuition in lacrosse, handball, basketball, volleyball and touch rugby. Cross-country

Our girls in particular performed well and all five runners finished in the top 20 out of 84 runners. Week 2, saw our Year 3/4 children compete. Again, we had great success from both individuals and as a team. The boys this time showed their abilities with every runner finishing in the top 20 again out of 85.

The final week saw teams of five compete in

relays. One lap each against 15 other schools meant it was fast and frenetic.

St. Dunstan's finished 1st overall and were officially crowned WASPs cross-country champions for a second year running. Well done everyone who took part.



Sportshall Athletics county finals



An early start on Thursday 8th March saw us travel to the Guildford Spectrum to take part in the Surrey Sportshall athletics county finals. With a range of track and field events, 20 of our children from Year 6 took part. Competition was

Swimming – Mr A. Coyle – Senior Teacher

Swimming lessons will commence on Tuesday 2nd May.

Please note that due to SATS, Year 6 will start their swimming the week commencing Monday 15th May.

As always, parents will be notified of any timetable changes in advance via Schoolcomms.

On the day of your child's lesson, they will need to remember to bring their swimming bag with named swimming costume or trunks (not bikinis or Bermuda shorts please) and a towel or towelling robe that is big enough to wrap around your child when they get out of the water. All children will require a swimming hat. Plain coloured swimming hats are available to purchase from the school via your Scopay account at a cost of £3.00. Items ordered via Scopay will be ready for collection the following day. You can access your Scopay account here <https://www.scopay.com/login> Please write your child's name in waterproof black pen on the outside of your child's swimming hat so our swimming teachers can identify children easily in the water.

If your child is well enough to be in school but is suffering from a cold/cough, we do encourage you to send in their swimming bag, as swimming is a statutory part of the National Curriculum. If you strongly feel they should not swim for health reasons, please ensure you send in a letter to the class teacher explaining the reason why. This should be a one off exceptional circumstance not a weekly occurrence. Please encourage your child to be resilient and independent. Independent children are independent learners who thrive and grow and can deal with the challenges that life brings. Our aim is to provide as many opportunities for each child as we can physically fit in, but please be aware that at times we do need to make changes to the timetable.

We are really looking forward to the start of swimming at school. It is always one of the highlights of the year for the children, with the sun shining and learning with friends. Our children are lucky to have these opportunities and we are blessed to have our own pool, which means we do not have to spend lots of money on hiring other pools and transport. Swimming, is an essential life skill that all children need to feel confident doing, it can save lives.

As mentioned by Mrs Birch earlier in this newsletter, a reminder that summer uniform can be worn from **Tuesday 2nd May** for those who wish. Summer uniform is optional.

If you would like your child to wear summer uniform, please note:

- Grey shorts must be smart, like short school trousers. Not cargo shorts with pockets on the outsides as these are casual shorts.
- Shorts should be no longer than the knee. Three quarter trousers are not allowed.
- White polo shirts can only be worn with smart grey shorts, not with long trousers.
- Summer dresses are pink and white stripes (thin stripes) not checks.
- White, long or ankle length socks are worn with summer dresses. Trainer socks (foot only) are not allowed.
- Short grey socks (not black) are worn with shorts.

- Blazers must be worn to school every day. If the weather is exceptionally hot, we will send a Schoolcomms to inform parents that blazers are not required. Please teach your child to be resilient!

Summer PE uniform: Mr Coyle, PE Leader and Senior Teacher

As we move into the summer term and the warmer weather (hopefully!) arrives, it continues to be important that the children have the correct PE kit. On PE days it is even more advisable that children have a summer hat and water bottle. Although we endeavour to limit the time spent in direct sunlight it is inevitable that there will be exposure to the sun. Wearing the thicker maroon socks is not advisable in KS2 so if you could please supply a pair of white sports socks then the children will be far more comfortable.
