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Dear Parents,

Welcome back! I hope that you have all had a very peaceful Easter break with your families.



We ended the spring term as a school family saying farewell to Mrs Birch, Mrs R Turner and Mrs Murray. The retirement Mass and end of term Mass were very special in the way we were united as a community in sharing our thanks and love. I do feel very blessed to be taking on the role of Headteacher to such a wonderful school and school family.

Last month we had a 'Focus Visit' from the Primary Adviser at the Diocese. This was to support the school in identifying our strengths and any areas for improvement with our Catholic life and mission, quality of RE teaching and learning and the quality of prayer and liturgy. The visit was very thorough and hugely positive, in fact there were no areas for development! I thought it would be nice to share a summary of the feedback with you:

Pupils' knowledge in RE is extremely high and the standard of teaching and learning in RE is a key strength of the school. Pupil-led liturgies were well planned and allowed for deep, prayerful responses from pupils and there is an excellent chaplaincy provision. As a result, prayer and Catholic mission is truly central to the life of the school.

Over the holiday, there have been some upgrades and repairs to the premises to ensure the school is its very best for the children. The pool has had some repairs and has been cleaned and readied for the swimming lessons for children in Years 1 to 6 starting in the first week of May. We are hugely appreciative to the FOSD who have funded most of the pool's current repairs and those scheduled for the summer holiday.

The children have returned to school all looking very smart in their school uniform- thank you! On 1st May, children can wear summer uniform if parents wish. It is not compulsory, children can continue to wear their current uniform as it is often still quite chilly in May. As you know girls have the option of a summer dress or the alternative white, cotton, revere collared, fitted, short sleeved blouse worn with a school skirt and white socks. Mrs Hammond is kindly working with another clothing provider to source school summer dresses which we hope to sell via the school office. More details will follow.

The term ahead will be busy with learning, exciting trips, sports days and events. We look forward to sharing all of this school news with you on X and in the newsletters.

Activities and Events

Reception – Miss K Bingle: Head of EYFS

At the end of March, we were delighted to welcome Miller's Ark Farm to our school field. Farmer Dougie and Farmer Greg taught us lots of interesting information about the animals including what the animals eat and why they have tags on their ears. We were able to touch donkeys, sheep, goats and Kunekune piglets. Since their visit, we have been writing facts about our favourite farm animal. Our new focus text is "Rosie's Walk" by Pat Hutchins. We have already begun exploring the story and will be practising to retell and sequence the events of the book. The children particularly love acting out the story in the roles of Rosie the hen and the sly fox!



Year 1 – Mrs G. Corsini: Head of Year 1

Our topic in the Spring Term was 'God's and My Wonderful World'. As part of this topic, the children have been learning all about animals and the different groups they belong to. As a hook for this topic, we had an Animal workshop at school. The children were able to hold a selection of animals such as an African land snail, a giant stick insect and even a snake! We also met an adorable gerbil named peanut. She was so cute!



We felt incredibly lucky to have this opportunity in school; many of the children described it as "the best day ever". It has been lovely to hear Year 1 use some of the facts and vocabulary they learnt that morning to deepen their understanding of animals.



Year 2 – Miss L. Butler: Head of Year 2

The month of March was a huge success in Year 2! The children thought deeply about their impact on the environment through the text 'The Secret Sky Garden'. We were inspired to write excellent persuasive letters to our school Eco Council about renovating the Year 1 gardens.



One of our highlights within this theme was going on a traffic survey at Woking Retail Park. The children had to count all the vehicles that passed in a ten minute period. We were astonished at the large amount of transport we saw! On return to school the children totalled up their tally charts and thought about the affect transport has on God's wonderful world.



The children were so enthusiastic and represented our school superbly! We were very proud teachers.

There were many wonderful costumes for world book day. Everyone brought in their favourite books and created their own book profiles.

We are looking forward to another equally busy half term for Summer 1.



Year 4 – Miss H. Fail: Head of Year 4 and Senior Teacher

We celebrated two themed days during the month of March and both days were a great success for our children in Year 4. On World Book Day, it was wonderful to see the children's passion about their inspirational heroes and heroines, as they shared their notable achievements and character traits. As part of World Maths Day, the children learnt about money and had the opportunity to buy and sell items to different year groups. It would be wonderful if the children could continue practising using money at home, as real-life practice is invaluable for their understanding of this mathematical topic.



Finally, we would like to thank the parents who attended our recent Partners in Learning where the children proudly shared their work from a range of curriculum subjects.



Year 5 – Miss E. Roe: Head of Year 5

At the end of the term, the children showcased their writing abilities by producing outstanding descriptions inspired by the text 'Who Let the Gods Out,' comparing the transformation of feeble Prisoner 42 to the mighty Thanatos.

We were very proud of the Year 5 children and how they led Key Stage 2 in a beautiful reflection of the Stations of the Cross at the church. This experience guided us on a spiritual pilgrimage through each station, prompting contemplation on Jesus' love and sacrifice.



As we progress into this half term, we eagerly anticipate further explorations into the world of explorers, with a particular focus on the remarkable achievements of Ernest Shackleton.

Year 6 – Mrs S. Turner: Head of Year 6 and Senior Teacher

March was a fantastic month, filled with sensational work by our children. We delved into the deeper meaning of Jesus' words and actions during Holy Week in John's Gospel, reflecting on Lenten themes. 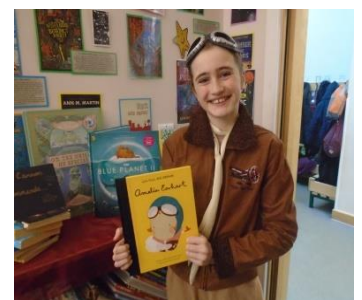

The children’s feedback and insights into key issues can really help to shape our school. Last term, Pupil Voice Reps listened to what their peers had to say about maths, prayer and worship, Art week, PE, sports and clubs.



In their discussion about prayer and worship, the children shared their thoughts on what made St. Dunstan’s special, ‘The peaceful and prayerful environment supports our faith and enables us to work together as a whole school family – we are always looking for ways to help others’. In response to Art week, they said ‘We were able to make deeper connections with God because of the time and delicacy it took to create our portraits. We spent prayerful time with God and were able to spread messages of the Holy Family’s love through our artwork’.

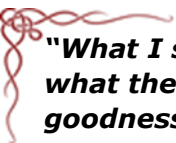

RE topics this term – Mrs S. Turner



"What I say is this: let the Spirit direct your lives, your selfish self is the opposite of what the Holy Spirit wants. The Spirit produces love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control."

(Based on Galatians 5: 16-17, 22-23)



Year groups 2 to 5 will study 'Pentecost' (Serving), with each year group exploring the theme through different topics. They will delve into the significance of Pentecost and how it empowers Christians to share the Good News of Jesus' love. By receiving and celebrating the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we gain strength to participate in the Church's mission. Children will learn about the Good News of Easter Sunday that Jesus is alive and loves us. They will also delve into the meaning of the Ascension, where Jesus promises the Holy Spirit and ascends to Heaven, leaving us with a promise too. Lastly, they will understand that Pentecost represents the bestowal of the Holy Spirit, empowering us to live as Christians and demonstrate God's love through our actions.

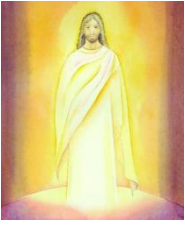

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Talk about good news in your family and how you shared it.

Ask your child to tell you the story of Pentecost and the work of the Holy Spirit.



This half term EYFS, Year 1 and 6 learning unit is called: To the Ends of the Earth. In this branch, the children will be delving into the events that unfolded after the Resurrection and Ascension, exploring the incredible impact of the Holy Spirit, and studying the remarkable work of the apostles and early Church. Additionally, they will gain an understanding of the Catholic Church in today's world, recognizing it as the apostolic Church and exploring how its liturgy and structures can be traced back to its early beginnings.

<p>EYFS</p> <p>In EYFS, we will learn about Jesus returning to his Father and sending the Holy Spirit to be with us always. The Holy Spirit, our special friend, takes care of us just like Jesus did. Acts 2:42-47 illustrates how the early Christian community lived out the good news of Jesus, aided by the Holy Spirit. We can depend on the Holy Spirit's constant presence in our lives.</p>	<p>SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES</p> <p><i>Although we can no longer see Jesus, we can still experience his presence in our everyday life.</i></p> <p>Join the parish on Pentecost Sunday and talk about how, when we make the sign of the cross, we are remembering that God is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We are saying we believe. You could make a Holy Spirit spinner.</p> <p>https://missiontogether.org.uk/calendar/resource-s-for-pentecost/</p> <p>Although we can no longer see Jesus, we can encounter him in different ways in our daily lives: In prayer - we can speak and listen to Jesus through praying; In reading scripture - we can read about the words and actions of Jesus through the Bible.</p> <p>Remember to ask if you can take home your class prayer bag for the weekend!</p> <p>Talk about the saints and those who help us grow closer to Jesus. Take a look at their prayers (such as St. Richard of Chichester). Share with your child a saint that you pray to or the saint you chose at your Confirmation.</p> <p>Has your family experienced Adoration at St. Dunstan's Church? Come and join us for this special time to connect with Jesus in the sacred host. Embrace the silence of Adoration.</p>
<p>Year 1</p> <p>In Year 1, we'll hear about the Road to Emmaus, Ascension and Pentecost. We'll explore Jesus' life, death and Resurrection, and learn how the Holy Spirit influenced the Apostles and early Church. Through these stories, we will connect the Good News of Jesus with the apostles' mission and witness the power of the Holy Spirit.</p>	
<p>Year 6</p> <p>In Year 6, we'll carry on with our exploration of John's Gospel. We've already looked at how the Fall affected our relationship with God, and now we'll dive into St John's account of the Resurrection. It connects back to that earlier story and shows us that through Jesus, our bond with God is restored. John draws parallels that will help the children relate to the sequence of salvation history. The role of the Holy Spirit is vital on this journey.</p>

As part of our month of Mary at school, our Year 3 children will proudly lead the Marian Liturgy at the Church on Friday 3rd May at 11.15am. Lower school will also share a special liturgy at the school.

These flowers will be crafted into beautiful class bouquets, which will be lovingly laid at our Marian Grotto located on the Lower School field. Reconciliation Service – Year 6

On Wednesday 6th March, our wonderful Year 6 children led us in a special Reconciliation liturgy. With their heartfelt songs, prayers, reflections, they guided us in exploring the meaning of forgiveness and how we can emulate Jesus' love for our fellow human beings, no matter the circumstances.

The liturgy emphasised that we all make mistakes and stumble at times, but that God accepts and loves us as we are, overflowing with boundless mercy.

The children shared a truly spiritually uplifting experience for everyone involved. Thank you, Year 6, for your beautiful contribution to our shared spiritual journey.

Prayer and Liturgy - Mrs O'Donovan

During the spring term, we journeyed with Jesus towards the cross. As part of our Lenten preparation, children in Year 5 and 6 received the Sacrament of Reconciliation with Fr Rob, Fr Nick and Fr Paul and Year 6 led a beautiful Reconciliation Service for everyone in Key Stage 2. The Reconciliation service gave everyone a chance to reflect on our own behaviour and choices and to think about the power of saying sorry and asking for forgiveness. The choice of music and the children's singing was particularly moving.

The staff also journeyed with Jesus in a Lenten prayer group that reflected upon the last words of Jesus when he was crucified - we used Jesus' words and artwork to help us to reflect on the themes of his final words.

On Friday 22nd March, Year 5 led a powerful Stations of the Cross for Key Stage 2. The children brought the stations of life with their acting and enabled us all to take our own pilgrimage with Jesus along the way of the cross. Mr F. Ellson supported Year 5 with the music that was a beautiful mix between traditional hymns such as "Were you there when they crucified the Lord?" to "The Blessing" which reminded us of the gift Jesus gave all of us through his death on the cross.

As the final part of our Lenten journey, Year 3 led the end of spring term Mass for the Parish and Key Stage 2 on Wednesday 27th March at the Church.

School Office

Lunch money for Summer Term 2024 – Mrs M. O’Riordan

School dinner costs for summer term are as follows: 1st half term £75.60, 2nd Half Term, £94.50, full term £170.10. Please remember that should you wish to change your child's meal choice from hot to cold or vice versa, one week's notice is required in writing.


We have had a number of occasions when parents have changed without notification to the school office. Not only does this cause an administrative difficulty when numbers do not tally but also means that the school is liable for the cost of the food order.

Therefore, if you change your child from school dinners to packed lunches without notification you will be liable for outstanding monies due to Surrey County Council.

Free School Meal Eligibility & Pupil Premium- Mrs C Turner - Bursar

We are aware, in the current climate that some families are struggling financially. If your circumstances have changed or if you earn less than £16,190 your child/children may be entitled to free school meals. By completing a form we can check this for you and usually we receive a response within 48 hours. Once eligibility is confirmed your child /children are the entitled to free schools meals for the duration of their education at primary school. Currently Surrey County Council are also funding food vouchers for the holiday periods. Swimming lessons for children in Years 1-6 will commence on Monday 29th April, (these lessons are kindly funded by the Friends of St. Dunstan's, which we are extremely grateful for). On the day of your child's lesson, they will need to remember to bring their swimming bag with named swimming costume or trunks (not bikinis/ tankinis or Bermuda shorts please) and a towel or towelling robe that is big enough to wrap around your child when they get out of the water. All children will require a swimming hat. These can be purchased from any sports shop, leisure centre or from the school office. Please write your child's name in waterproof black pen on the outside of your child's swimming hat so our swimming teachers can identify children easily in the water.

If your child is well enough to be in school but is suffering from a cold/cough, we do encourage you to send in their swimming bag, as swimming is a statutory part of the National Curriculum. If you strongly feel they should not swim for health reasons, please ensure you send in a letter to the class teacher. This should be a one off exceptional circumstance not a weekly occurrence. Please encourage your child to be resilient and independent. Independent children are independent learners who thrive and grow and can deal with the challenges that life brings. Our aim is to provide as many opportunities for each child as we can physically fit in, but please be aware that at times for unfortunate reasons a lesson may have to be cancelled or moved. We endeavour to inform you at the earliest possible instance in this case. Please see attached the day in which you child's class will be swimming.

We are still really looking forward to the start of swimming at school. It is always one of the highlights of the year for the children, with the sun shining and learning with friends. Our children are lucky to have these opportunities and we are blessed to have our own pool, it means we do not have

Uniform

Summer Uniform

A reminder that summer uniform can be worn from Wednesday 1st May for those who wish. Summer uniform is optional. The school uniform list can be found on the school website or [viewed here](#)

If you would like your child to wear summer uniform, please note:

- *Grey shorts must be smart, like short school trousers. Not cargo shorts with pockets on the outsides as these are casual shorts.*
- *Shorts should be no longer than the knee. Three quarter trousers are not allowed.*
- *White polo shirts can only be worn with smart grey shorts, not with long trousers.*
- *Summer dresses are pink and white stripes (thin stripes) not checks. The alternative to a Summer dress is a white, cotton, revere collared, fitted, short sleeved blouse that can be worn with a school skirt and white socks. We have looked into the availability of these blouses and they are available from a wide range of uniform suppliers such as M&S, TU, Valentinos, Very.*

- *White, long or ankle length socks are worn with summer dresses. Trainer socks (foot only) are not allowed.*
- *Short grey socks (not black) are worn with shorts.*
- *Blazers must be worn to school every day. If the weather is exceptionally hot, we will send a Schoolcomms to inform parents that blazers are not required. Please teach your child to be resilient!*

Summer PE uniform: Mr Coyle, PE Leader and Senior Leader

As we move into the summer term and the warmer weather (hopefully!) arrives, it continues to be important that the children have the correct PE kit. On PE days it is even more advisable that children have a summer hat and water bottle. Although we endeavour to limit the time spent in direct sunlight it is inevitable that there will be exposure to the sun. Wearing the thicker maroon socks is not advisable in Key Stage 2 so if you could please supply a pair of white sports socks then the children will be far more comfortable.

- 3. Preparation of annual accounts, arranging audit and submission to Charity Commission. If needed FOSD could contract this to an external company.*
- 4. Managing cash flow. Making cash payments to the bank, securing float money before big events. This can be done infrequently as we can hold cash in the school office for a short time.*
- 5. Keeping track of card-reader payments and availability. FOSD has card-readers that we use for different events. These just need to be in the right-place at the right-time. This is a task easily shared by the whole committee.*
- 6. Ensure there are available people to manage cash-flow at big events. This can be a shared job across the committee.*

Without a Treasurer we will need to cut back on FOSD events, which will clearly impact what we are able to contribute to the school.

So far this Academic Year the school has received £30K from FOSD with which they have purchased everyday items such as library subscriptions, teaching books, chrome-books, balance bikes and scooters as well as larger items including PE mats and we have undertaken some repairs to the swimming pool.

Looking ahead FOSD will contribute to the '***The St Benedict Project***', which will be a complete remodelling of the upstairs Art Studio. This will provide a much-improved artistic-experience for students.
