

Pupil-led Prayer and Liturgy Progression of Skills



As a Catholic School, we have a particular mission to reveal to the children who Jesus is and to teach them how to know Him, love Him and follow Him. As with all relationships, knowing and loving someone depends on spending time with them, speaking to them and listening to what they have to say to us. This is what is meant by prayer. We are inviting the young people in our care to spend time with Jesus - speaking to Him, listening to Him and hearing what He wants to say to us in our lives today.

Each of us comes into a relationship with Jesus in our own way - in His own time - and therefore this staged progression is for guidance only. It is important to recognise that each relationship with Jesus through prayer is an individual journey and may progress in different ways, at different times.

Learning a range of traditional prayers e.g. Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be Beginning to lead a variety of prayers in class Joining in with spontaneous prayers Experiencing other Catholic prayer traditions e.g. Adoration, Visio Divina
У4	 Choosing a scripture reading for a Liturgy with adult support based on a theme from a range of given options. Showing an understanding of why it is appropriate. Beginning to lead parts of the Liturgy e.g. reading the scripture 	 Beginning to lead or write spontaneous prayers Join in with Catholic prayer traditions e.g. Adoration, Rosary, Visio Divina Join in with the prayers of the church e.g. Act of Contrition, Creed Lead daily class prayers
У5	 Planning and leading at least one part of a Liturgy with adult support e.g. Gather, Listen, Respond and Go Forth 	Lead and write spontaneous prayers
У6	 Planning and leading at least one part of a liturgy independently. Being able to explain why they made these choices in relation to the purpose of the Liturgy. 	 Leading a decade of the Rosary Learn the prayers of the church e.g. Act of Contrition, Creed
Those working at greater depth/ Faith Ambassadors	 Independently planning a whole liturgy using the Gather, Listen, Respond, Go Forth format. Planning each stage appropriately based on a theme. Self-evaluating their choices in response to engagement of participants.
