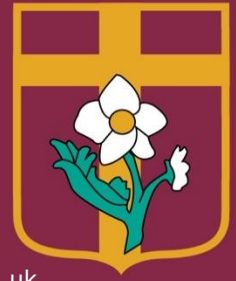

Activities and Events

EYFS – Miss K Bingle: Head of EYFS



The children were absolutely *buzzing* after our special workshop with Pauline and Greg from Guildford Beekeepers Association. Both Greg and Pauline are beekeepers themselves, and shared with us how they look after the bees in their hives. The children were fascinated by the model of a working hive, and were allowed to try on some of Greg's special beekeeping protective clothing too! We learnt so many new facts about bees, including the role of the queen bee, worker bee and drone bee in the hive. It is wonderful to hear the children excitedly share their



new knowledge with their friends and teachers. The children will be applying their knowledge by writing their favourite bee facts, drawing accurate diagrams of bees and creating posters to raise awareness of how other people can look after bees.

"The bees do a wiggle dance in a figure of 8 to communicate how far away the flowers are".

"The drone bees are all males and the worker bees are female and do all the work!"

We would like to thank Greg, Pauline and the Guildford Beekeepers Association for volunteering their time and helping bring the learning alive for the children.



Year 1 – Mrs G. Corsini: Head of Year 1

As part of our history topic 'What changes have my family seen?' Year 1 participated in a series of exciting workshops at Milestones Museum called 'Homes and Games'. In our first activity we learnt all about homes from the past. We explored room-sets of a typical kitchen in the 1930's/1940's, and then had the opportunity to compare them with those from the present. For our 'Games' workshop the children experienced 'play time in the past' through active participation with a range of toys and games dating from within living memory. We played some traditional games like hopscotch and dominoes, and explored a mystery box filled with games we were not familiar with. We had to guess how to play the games and then learnt to play them together. Pick-Up-Sticks and tiddlywinks were some of our favourites! It was a fantastic day and the children were, as always, an absolute credit to St. Dunstan's.



Year 2 – Miss L. Butler: Head of Year 2

As part of World Earth Day, Year 2 have been thinking about how to care for God's wonderful world. The children wrote special pledges about how they can take care of the planet. We spent time reflecting on the use of plastic and the negative impact it has on our environment.

In History we have just started our new topic 'Space Explorers'. The children started by going on a treasure hunt and finding information about Neil Armstrong, Mary Jackson and Katherine Johnson. We were amazed that Katherine Johnson lived until the age of 101! We are very excited to continue with our learning and find out more about these important individuals.



We are looking forward to welcoming you for our recorder concert on Tuesday 14th May.

Year 3 – Miss N. Maloney: Head of Year 3 and Assistant Headteacher

As part of our learning about plants, the children have been conducting a fair test. We have planted broad bean seeds, ensuring the same amount of soil and identical pots. They changed just one variable each time. One plant has no light, one has no space, one has no water, one has no soil, and one has no air. The control pot has everything our seed needs to thrive. The children are very careful to water at the same time each day with the same amount of water and they have made predictions about what might happen, but as yet, the seeds have not sprouted. The children are anticipating a change any day now!



Year 4 – Miss H. Fail: Head of Year 4 and Senior teacher

It has been a physically challenging start to the summer term for Year 4 with many children taking part in Bikeability and all children developing their swimming, frisbee and tennis skills in PE!

As part of the Bikeability programme, the children learnt to glide, control their bike, pedal with control and be aware of their surroundings. All of these skills are great stepping stones to be able to cycle on the road in future years. In their PE lessons, the children have been practising basic skills of throwing and catching with frisbees and serving and returning tennis balls. It has been wonderful to see the teamwork they have shown when taking part in these activities.



Year 5 – Miss L. Roe: Head of Year 5 and Senior Teacher

This term, Year 5 embarked on an exciting journey into the icy depths of the Antarctic, led by the legendary explorer, Ernest Shackleton. Immersed in Shackleton's remarkable journey, they are crafting a non-chronological report detailing his ambitious quest to cross the South Pole. Through the use of maps, they traced Shackleton's footsteps, understanding the challenges he faced.

In geography, Year 5 are focusing on India's conservation efforts to protect the tiger and its habitat. We're proud to announce that Year 5 are enthusiastically participating in tiger conservation by sponsoring a tiger—a tangible contribution to their learning journey.



Year 6 – Mrs S. Turner: Head of Year 6 and Senior Teacher

What a fantastic April it has been in Year 6! The children have been engaged in brilliant group work exploring our topic, The Islamic Golden Age. They are delving into the historical Islamic world once ruled by caliphates, where science, economic growth, and cultural achievements thrived. Using written clues as their primary evidence, the children collaborated to create maps depicting ancient Baghdad. We are looking forward to our trip to the local Peace Garden and exploring design and architecture we see there.



Alongside SATs preparation, we have investigated light, understanding its straight-line travel and how we see objects through light reflection. To top it off, the year group have embraced drama by immersing themselves in Hamlet, crafting their own soliloquys. It has been a great start to the summer term, filled with intellectual curiosity and creative energy.

St Dunstan's Bake Off – Mr A Coyle



On **Wednesday 8th May**, we will be holding our annual St. Dunstan's Bake Off. This is an exciting opportunity for the children to test their inner Mary Berry, or Paul Hollywood and enter the competition. The competition is split in to Lower School (Years R, 1 and 3) and Key Stage 2, with all the tasty treats being sold at the end of the day. The Key Stage 1 creations will be available after school on the Lower School playground, with the Key Stage 2 treats on the Middle School playground.



The FOSD will kindly be helping staff sell the cakes, so please come along with a few pounds to enjoy a sweet treat.

The theme for this year's Bake Off will be based around the Olympics. With the games being held in Paris, we look forward to welcoming any creations based on an element of the games, such as running, throwing, jumping etc. Let your imaginations run wild and we look forward to seeing all the entries on Wednesday 8th May.

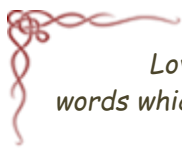
Faith in Action

RE learning this term– Mrs S. Turner, RE Leader and Senior Teacher



Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your souls and with all your might. These words which I am commanding you today must remain in your heart.

Deuteronomy 6: 4-9



Year groups Two to Five are concluding their exploration of 'Pentecost' (Serving), delving into the significance of this event and learning how the Holy Spirit empowers Christians to share the Good News of Jesus' love. By receiving and celebrating the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, children gain strength to engage in the Church's mission.

In the upcoming month, they will explore 'Reconciliation', learning about the role the Holy Spirit in our lives. This unit will focus on understanding how God helps us make good choices, reflect when we make wrong choices, and follow Jesus' teachings on forgiveness. The children will also explore the concept of examination of conscience and the stages of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, including admitting wrongs and seeking reconciliation with God and others. Through this learning, children will develop a deeper understanding of Jesus' attitudes towards sinners and his teachings on forgiveness.

As they learn to live more closely in Christ, they consider their motives and emotions which influence choices.

Year 2 **Rules** – Reasons for rules in the Christian family

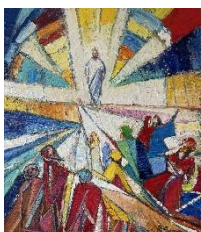
Year 3 **Choices** – Importance of examination of conscience

Year 4 **Building Bridges** – Admitting wrong, being reconciled with God and each other.

Year 5 **Freedom and Responsibility** – Commandments enable Christians to be free and responsible.

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Take together about times when you have forgiven or been forgiven. Discuss the importance of saying sorry. Look for opportunities for forgiveness and reconciliation in the day to day life of the family.



This half term EYFS, Year 1 and 6 will continue to build on their learning about a unit titled: To the Ends of the Earth. In this branch, the children will be delving into the events that unfolded after the Resurrection and Ascension, exploring the incredible impact of the Holy Spirit, and studying the remarkable work of the apostles and early Church. An overview of this topic and an explanation about changes to RE was shared in last months' newsletter. Do take a look at ways in which you might explore this learning with your child at home and at Mass.

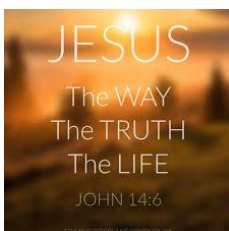
PENTECOST (Sunday 19th May)

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School Office

48hr absence rule for diarrhoea and vomiting

Please support us and other children and parents by ensuring that if your child has diarrhoea or vomiting that you keep them off school for 48hrs from the last episode. This is NHS recommendations to limit the spread of illnesses such as stomach bugs.



We would ask parents where possible to inform the school office in advance of any medical consultants, orthodontist appointments and hospital appointments that are coming up. Please note that routine medical/dental/optician check-up appointments are not normally authorised during school hours, but we understand that some appointments are made with exceptional circumstances. A Pupil Absence Form must be completed with a copy of the appointment letter attached. Alternatively please show the School Office your appointment confirmation email or text message when handing in your form.

DBS (Disclosure & Barring Service)

i A reminder please, that if you have recently undertaken a new DBS clearance to volunteer at the school, please register for the UPDATE service. This is a free service for volunteers and does mean that we can do an online check when you wish to help on any school trips/events etc. You only have 30 days from the date of issue of your certificate in which to subscribe. Lunch money for Summer Term 2023– Mrs M. O’Riordan

School dinner costs for Summer Term are as follows: half term £75.60, full term £170.10.

Please remember that should you wish to change your child’s meal choice from hot to cold or vice versa, one week’s notice is required in writing as orders are made in advance.

We have had a number of occasions when parents have changed without notification to the school office. Not only does this cause an administrative difficulty when numbers do not tally but also means that the school is liable for the cost of the food order.

Therefore, if you change your child from school dinners to packed lunches without notification you will be liable for outstanding monies due to Surrey County Council. Lunch monies will be due until the date change is confirmed by the school office.

The children have been really excited with the commencement of swimming lessons this half term. The pool reopening seems to have brought about a change in the weather and the lessons have taken place under clear blue skies. It has been lovely to hear the splashing of arms and legs and welcome back out fantastic swimming teachers.

The children gain so much from swimming lessons. Not only they do they enjoy becoming water confident and swimming in lessons with their peers, but they are also learning lifelong skills. To have the knowledge that if you ever become troubled in water you are able to save yourself is essential in life.

Swimming is part of the national curriculum and we are very fortunate that our children are able to swim each year, from year one upwards. Please can I ask that, unless your child is particularly unwell, or has a medical need, they swim



with their class. It is pivotal that we help the children swim 25metres on a variety of strokes, by the time they leave us at Year 6.

We do have spare kits in school that we can offer to the children if they forget their kit. We look forward to every child joining in with swimming lessons over the next term and hearing all their excitement and joy in the water.

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Friends of St Dunstan's - Swimming Donations

Swimming lessons for children from Year 1 upwards, has started on April 29th. This is part of their summer term curriculum and is a fantastic opportunity for the children who attend the school; as few schools are fortunate enough to have their own pool on site. The school (with additional funding from the Governor's Maintenance Fund) finances the cost of running and maintaining the pool. The Friends of St Dunstan's School request that you make a donation to help cover the cost of the swimming teachers.

FOSD request that, where possible, each family makes a voluntary donation of £10 per child who benefits from these lessons. This will go towards the cost of providing swimming lessons for all our children, which in total costs around £5500.
